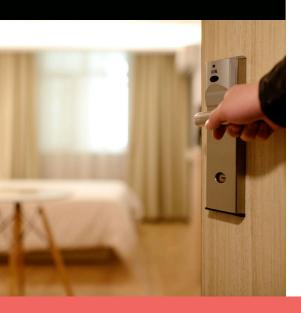


ESSENTIAL ENERGY SAVING TIPS FOR HOTELS







HOUSEKEEPING CHECKS

Temperature in Vacant Rooms

Ensure the heating has been switched off between bookings, only turning it back on the morning of check-in. This includes towel heaters that are often left on 24/7.

Temperature in Occupied Rooms

Often, guests leave the heating on high when they leave for the day. Housekeeping should change thermostats to 21°C and turn radiator controls down to the middle setting if either is set higher than this.

Corridor Temperatures

19°C is the ideal temperature for corridor areas. If using radiators, set to the middle setting.



NIGHT PORTER SECURITY WALK-AROUNDS

Night porter walk-arounds provide an excellent opportunity to maximise energy saving through double-checking the back and front of house.

Equipment

Check that the kitchen extraction is off and that any heating in unoccupied communal areas, such as the restaurant or seating areas, is off.

Lighting

Where PIR lighting is unavailable, check that all non-essential lighting is off, such as lamps, fridge lights and in function rooms.
